Managed retreat is one of the common coastal adaptation strategies presented alongside protect and accommodate (Nicholls et al, 2007). Managed retreat involves relocating

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people and infrastructure from areas of high risk, to areas of lesser risk (Turbott & Stewart, 2008), and would lessen exposure to flood risk and loss.

A key campaign success and ongoing project for the Surfrider Foundation Ventura County Chapter is the Surfers' Point Managed Shoreline Retreat.. Instead of building a seawall or other coastal armor, which would have destroyed the beach and surf break, stakeholders came together and approved a plan to move the parking lot, pedestrian path, and bike path away from the tideline.
